1. Brief Daily Summaries

20.06.2009 – Arrival and Introduction

The first batch of the delegation was welcomed at the airport in Hamburg by Ronjon Chakrabarti and Lukas Schäfer on Sunday. After checking in at the hotel and having lunch in an Indian Restaurant (1), the introduction workshop was conducted by Dr. Regina Dube and Ronjon Chakrabarti and the dialogue reader was handed out (2). In the late afternoon, a city tour focussing on urban renewal projects was conducted (3), followed by the welcome dinner (4). By evening the second and third batch arrived.

21.09.2009- Solid Waste and Recycling

On Monday morning, the delegates were welcomed by Mr. Jörg Lühmann, head of the senators' office of the Ministry of Urban Development and Environment (BSU). The head of the waste management department, Mrs. Schekahn, gave an overview on the development, organisation and future tasks of the waste management in Hamburg (1). After being invited to the Restaurant Deichgraf by the Hamburg Ministry, the recycling plant of the company BESTSORT was visited. The head of the plant, Mr. Olaf Hartig, explained the technical processes of the enterprise (2) and showed the delegation the various steps of recycling and sorting of commercial waste (3,4). In the evening an urban forest in Hamburg was visited and its importance for the regional recreation shown by Dr. Regina Dube (5,6).

22.09.2009 – Solid Waste and Composting

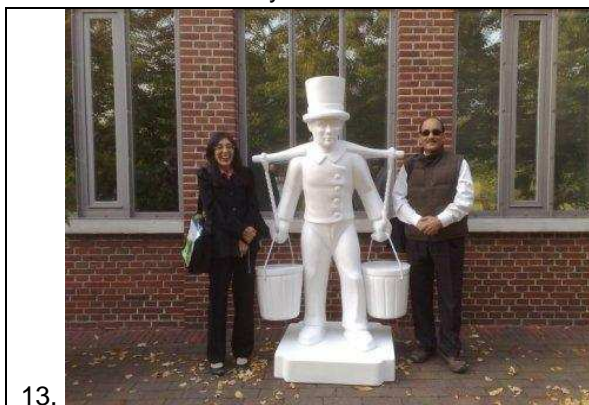
On the third day of the exposure dialogue, the topic of solid waste management was dealt with in depth. Mr. Reinhardt Fiedler explained the organisation, services, finances, and awareness rising campaign of the Stradtreinigung Hamburg (SRH) (7). Mr. Jörn Franck gave a technical insight into the PPP project of the waste incineration plant Stelling Moor (8). In the following site visit of the incineration plant, discussions on the applicability of the used technologies and logistics were held with the experts. The adjoining biogas plant, handling organic wastes incl. food waste (9), and the recycling reception point were taken a look at (10).

In the afternoon an automatic bio composting plant of SRH in Butzberg was visited. Dr. Anke Boisch, head of the plant, explained the process of pre-treatment and composting of the organic waste (11). Especially interesting was the fact that this plant uses only very little space and time for the composting process compared to conventional composting plants (12). In the evening the museum for toy trains was visited, followed by a stroll through the inner city of Hamburg.



23.09.2009 – Water supply and waste water treatment

The topic for Wednesday was water supply, waste water treatment and canalisation. Hamburg Water, the public company in charge for the water supply of the city, was visited (13). The delegation was warmly welcomed by Dr. Kim Augustin, head of the Technology Department of the Hamburg Water Group (14). Peter Hoppe, head of the Department Network explained the historic development of drinking water supply, operation and maintenance, as well as the detection of water leakages. The historic development of the sewer system, storm water management and surface water protection plans were presented by Mr. Klaus Krieger, head of the department Sewage Network Construction. This was followed by a presentation on the operation and maintenance practices of sewers, by Mrs. Iris Carstensen, head of the Sewer Network District. Before having lunch on invitation by Hamburg Water, Dr. Kim Augustin discussed on the Hamburg Water Cycle and its aims to save water and energy resources. After lunch, Hamburg's biggest waste water treatment plant Köhlbrandhöft-Dradenau was visited. Mr. Frank Laurich gave an introduction to the historic development of the plant (15). Central and decentral concepts for waste water treatment were discussed. Taking into account the experiences of the last years, nowadays according to Mr. Laurich a decentral approach is to be preferred. After having a look at the various steps of the waste water treatment, including the sludge stabilisation eggs (17), the delegation was led back to the city centre by ferry, accompanied by Mr. Bertram who had organised the programme for the day (18). Possibilities of future cooperation were discussed on the ferry ride.



24.09.2009 – Spatial Planning and European Green Capital

The agenda on Thursday was dedicated to spatial planning and Hamburg achievement in winning the contest on becoming the European Green Capital for the year 2011. Mr. Andreas Kellner and Rheinhard Schier presented recent the city planning projects of Hamburg in the Stadtmodell (19). Mr. Hans Peter Schneider from the Infocenter of the Hafencity gave insights into the planning of the Hafencity Hamburg and discussed various criteria for the renewal of the district (20). On a walk through the Hafencity, the most important buildings and constructions were visited and their role and contribution to the Hafencity concept explained (21). After lunch Dr. von Vogel, senior advisor in European affairs and main organiser of the Hamburg programme, gave a presentation on Hamburg's efforts and achieved goals, which led to the successful candidature of Hamburg to be European Green Capital in 2011. He accompanied the delegation to the official reception in the town Hall where Ms. Anja Hajduk, Senator for Urban Development and Environment of Hamburg welcomed the Indian Experts. The welcome was accompanied by several members of the Hamburg parliament, the Indian General Consul, experts the group had met in the past days and administrative bureaucrats of the city state Hamburg (23). After the speech of Ms. Hajduk and the response of the head of the delegation Mr. Pande, Joint Secretary of the Ministry of Environment and Forest, Ms. Sarojini Thakur, Additional Chief Secretary, Himachal Pradesh Government Secretariat, handed over a gift to the Senator (24). The official reception was topped off by a guided tour through the Town Hall.

25.09.2009 Climate Change and Harbour Development

The last day in Hamburg began with an introduction on employment incentives related to climate change by Mr. Prüss from the BSU, followed by Mr. Lindlahr from the BSU showing the various initiatives of the ministry aiming at reducing GHG emissions in the city. Thereafter, the bio-algae research project of EON was visited, led by Ms. Beate Bussink Becking from the BSU. At the site, Dr. Kerner explained the approach of using solar light and exhaust air from a power plant for the production of biomass which could then be used energetically (25-27). After a business lunch on behalf of EON, the delegation was welcomed by Mr. Wolfgang Becker, environmental strategist of the Hamburg Port Authority who conducted a guided harbour tour on a traditional visitor boat through the harbour area (28). The focus of the tour was on the new development projects of the Hamburg Port, including the fully automatic container port (29). Dr. Elisabeth Klocke from the BSU held a presentation on the environmental aspects of the harbour and the deepening of the Elbe River (30). In the evening parts of the group visited the "Planten un Blomen" Exhibition.

26. and 27. 09.2009 Travel and site visits to sustainable urban development in Berlin

Saturday morning was free for the delegation. After having lunch together, the group left Hamburg and headed for Berlin by the super fast ICE train. In the evening a short walk through the renewed historic eastern city centre led to an Indian restaurant (31).

On Sunday morning the delegates explored Berlin on their own (32). The programme started after having lunch near to the newly developed Friedrichstrasse in Berlin. The thematic city tour, led by Mr. Christian Hayer from Berlin Info, focussed on urban development projects conducted over the last years. Of great interest for the delegates was a water reuse project, being set up by the Berlin Senate (33) and the river front development at various places of the city(34).

28.09.2009 Sustainable Transport, Low emission zone and evaluation

On Monday the Berlin Senate for Urban development was visited. Mr. Rainer Nagel, head of the division for Urban Planning and Open Spaces, gave an introduction to the Berlin city development followed by a scientific review of the implementation of a low emission zone in Berlin by Mr. Martin Lutz, head of the sector Air Quality Assessment and Pollution Control of the Ministry for Health, Environment and Consumer Protection (35). After lunch, the delegates had a short look at the model of Berlin (36). Then Dr. Jürgen Murach introduced the delegates to the Berlin concept of sustainable transport and the group visited the new regional station Gesundbrunnen (37) and the new main train station of Berlin, all by taking public transport to the locations. In the evening, the whole trip was jointly evaluated by the participants and possible follow-up activities were worked out (please refer to the next chapter Evaluation). The exposure dialogue ended officially with the farewell dinner (38). The next day the delegates departed for their return trip to India in several batches.

2. Evaluation

Evaluation Form

All participants filled in standardized evaluation forms from the Overseas Exposure Visit.

The overall impression of the filled forms is that the training was relevant for each participant. The methodology and learning effect as well as the German and Indian Experts were mostly rated excellent or good. In almost all cases the objectives of the workshop were rated as achieved or mostly achieved. The organisation was mostly rated excellent or good. Follow-up proposals mentioned the adaptation of the visited best practice projects to the Indian context and more facilitation by the German partners in implementation of projects. Especially the fields of solid waste, sewage and water distribution were named by several participants.

Personal comments by the participants (briefly summarised)

During the evaluation workshop all participants gave a small verbal feedback to the exposure dialogue giving comments four main aspects:

1. What was most interesting in the tour (could have been stressed on more)
2. What was least interesting (could have as well been left away)
3. What could be improved in the programme
4. One important follow-up of the dialogue.

The answers were very diverse as every participant had different topics on which she or he focussed. Thus all topics on the tour were named as interesting: city planning, city development plans, solid waste management, water supply, water and waste water management, sewerage treatment plant, water recycling, low emission zone, climate change, public transport and especially all the field visits. In general nothing should have been left away. After having experienced German best practices examples in governance, urban infrastructure and city development several participants mentioned to have more interest in the German political and administrative structure and institutional setup, the budget of municipalities and the property records. It was mentioned that the exposure visit should have been extended to further cities and a follow up visit could be initiated.

Conclusions

The exposure dialogue, being able to take into consideration all topics requested by the Indian partner, was successfully conducted. We got the impression that the delegation group consisting of high officials from the decision taking levels from the MoEF and the state and city governments and municipal corporations were satisfied with the results of the 9 day tour. All participants showed a keen interest in the topics and professional knowledge regarding their specific working area which led to valuable discussions with the various experts. The discussions were effective in giving better ideas for implementation of Urban Renewal Projects.

3. Follow-ups

Future Cooperation

All visits were rated as very interesting and relevant for the upcoming works of the Indian delegation. The delegates and the German hosts exchanged contacts in various cases in order to follow up for joint future projects.

Solid Waste Management

The topic of solid waste management seemed to be essential for the majority of the participants. It is suggested to follow up with the German experts in order to facilitate support in the implementation of solid waste collection, treatment and disposal projects in India.

Water supply, sewage networks and waste water treatment plants

Several delegates mentioned to have interest in setting up or improving the drinking water supply in their cities as well as the sewage network and waste water treatment plants. Hamburg Water Group, being a public owned entity with an interest to provide a service to the inhabitants, seemed a good partner for the facilitation of the technical know-how and experience. Adelphi Consult could support the German and Indian Team in organising the meetings and preparing the documents with the background information. Its water team has long lasting experience in the moderation of technology transfer and development cooperation between Germany and India in the field of water and sanitation.

Information on the German political system and institutional setup

Several delegates asked for more information on the German political system and institutional setup of the municipalities, including the financial budget and property record of the visited cities.
